We plan to include a KSPC section in this newsletter for the points relevant to Selsley. The KSPC have been discussing their hub meetings. They have been held in Kings Stanley at 9.30 on a Monday, three times a month. We used one of these meetings to raise traffic issues and it was always thought that it is really useful to have the ability to drop in and raise issues without appointment. While the KSPC meetings are fairly informal, the hub sessions are more informal still, and this will suit some people. They are hardly getting used at all and have been temporarily suspended until a new formula can be decided on.

- 1). One or two sessions per month, not three.
- 2). That we hold some in Selsley throughout the year, and maybe some in Middleyard if there is a suitable building. This may reduce the "overlooking of the smaller villages" factor.
- 3). That KSPC hold at least one hub meeting each month in the early evening so that working people can attend.
- 4). That KSPC get the word out more effectively. The KSPC has a Facebook page which has been mothballed. A new Facebook page will be set up soon, (hopefully with a more inclusive name.)

### Treasurer Roll

Selsley Community Group (SCG) is looking to recruit a volunteer to take on the role of treasurer following the AGM in January 2026. While this is an important role, the annual income and expenditure is relatively small and the job is therefore not complex. Basic numeracy, being familiar with using spreadsheets as well as having attention to detail are probably the most important skills.

The role includes:

- Maintaining SCG's bank account and, together with the Secretary, agreeing payments issued by the group;
- Ensuring that cash and other receipts are paid without delay into the SCG bank account;
- Ensuring that records of income and expenditure are maintained;
- Ensuring compliance with any relevant requirements;
- Reporting on the group's financial position at SCG meetings;
- Advising on financial implications of any planned SCG events;
- Presenting an annual financial report to the AGM;
- Preparing relevant documents for annual inspection by an independent assessor;
- Arranging public liability insurance for the group.
